

Coronation Celebrations and Activities in line with the King's passion for the Environment

Children will be measuring out 1 sq m plots and recording the number of mini beasts and different plants/grass types. This will be part of a larger biodiversity study of our school grounds. Then our biodiversity committee will decide on the best location for nursery children to spread seeds for wild flowers. Also some children will be doing a lot of grass seeding and making mini wind mills to keep the birds off.

Meanwhile, the wooden planters around school will be weeded and filled with as many red, white & blue flowers that we can source.
